







## Document A : plan général des lieux historiques en Egypte

Hermopolis  
Houses the temple of the god Thoth

The fertile strips running either side of the Nile show the extent to which the river floods each year.

An oasis: imports of salt, dates and reeds come from here

City of the Sun God Re

Turah  
Stone from this quarry was used to build the pyramids

A copper mine

Red Sea

A ship returning from Punt on the African coast

A vast expanse of desert with nothing in it

12 Buhen Fort, one of a ring of nine forts
